AMANDA


Amanda absolutely loved her session at Camp Hazen. She had tears of joy when we picked her up and has talked nonstop about every experience and all the new friends she made.

We teach resilience through arguments with friends--encouraging those involved to listen with intent to understand another's perspective.

confidence in our young people, that they will lead by example of generosity and
connectedness.




