- HOPE was founded in 2004 by concerned community members in Old Saybrook.
- HOPE's first affordable housing community is a 16-unit project in Old Saybrook called Ferry Crossing.
- HOPE focuses exclusively on expanding affordable housing in small, high opportunity towns.

BUILDING UP COMMUNITIES THROUGH AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The Lofts at Spencer's Corner opened in 2021 as 17 units of rental housing on the Main Street corridor in Centerbrook. As part of a series of mixed-use buildings, The Lofts brought new energy to an important part of the town.

With over 100 qualified initial applicants, The Lofts is fulfilling a demonstrated need in the region for deeply affordable housing. With 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom rental units designated for households making up to 30%, 50%, and 80% of area median income, The Lofts has been an important addition to the inventory of affordable homes in the area.

TARGETED LOCATION

Essex has some of the highest housing costs in the state of Connecticut, making it inaccessible to many households.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

We helped create affordable housing to complement the commercial and retail uses at Spencer's Corner – reinvigorating an underutilized part of Centerbrook's Main Street.

SUPPORTING HOUSEHOLDS

More than 35 people in low-tomoderate income households now live in modern and secure affordable homes.
